



CATCH is a European funded project that aims to reduce traffic generated air pollution in three cities. This will be achieved by reducing harmful emissions from buses, encouraging healthy urban lifestyles and promoting walking and cycling.

The project will largely be demonstrated in Liverpool, with similar measures being implemented in Italy and Romania.

CATCH started in 2002 and will run for 3 years until 2005, being co-ordinated by Merseytravel and managed on their behalf by Transport & Travel Research Ltd.

CATCH is a demonstration project in the European Commission's Life-Environment Programme. It supports the EC's Sixth Environmental Action Programme by promoting sustainable mobility in order to improve air quality.
